Falls City Produce Giveaway

Falls City has recently been able to procure more food for distribution through the Friday afternoon Falls City Produce Giveaway at Mountain Gospel Fellowship Church.

Dani Haviland of Falls City Thrives and her husband, Marty Haviland, have managed to acquire over \$5000 worth of shelf stable foods through a partnership with Polk County Family and Community Outreach. Brent DeMoe of PC-FCO also has a grant in place that will allow the Havilands to bring in over \$1000 worth of additional food monthly to the community for the next eighteen months. What a blessing we've received!

Fresh Produce and breads from Marion Polk Food Share are still distributed every Friday, from 4:30 to 5:30 at the MGF church (next to the mini market). NO identification or proof of income is required to get food assistance here.

Food and monetary donations are always appreciated but not necessary. Remember, if you're able to plant a garden and grow more than you need – or have more than enough seedlings started - show up on Fridays at 3:30 PM and our crew will help distribute your surplus to the community.

"Smart" Water Meter Installation

The City of Falls City was the recipient of a grant from the Oregon Water Resources Department to upgrade our water meters which are nearing the end of their serviceable life span.

The installation of our new "Smart" water meters (with radio frequency for remote reading) is scheduled for the middle of July.



The new meters will allow our staff to record monthly water usage in hours versus days, with much more accurate readings.

At each individual property, the work should not last more than an hour, and before the water service is paused, installing staff will notify property owners.
